Pastor's Post

As life settles back into its regular fall routine it is good to take time to reflect on what our membership in the church means. I'm often asked what it takes to be a member of the church. Entry into membership, as you remember when you joined, involves proclaiming faith in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. The three questions we ask are 1) Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love? 2) Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love? 3) Will you be a faithful member of this congregation, giving of yourself in every way, and will you seek the fellowship of the church wherever you may be? The only requirement for membership is faith in Jesus.

I'm also often asked what does it cost to be a member of the church. I am a member of Rotary International and to be part of Rotary there are quarterly dues. The unique thing about membership in the church is that it costs nothing and it costs everything. The church does not require dues that one pays to become a member. We encourage each member to pledge and give an offering as a response to God but the donation and the amount are freely decided by each member. On the other hand, to be a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ costs everything – we need to devote our whole beings to being his disciple. We can't do it half-heartedly.

Finally the church is also unique in what its membership means. C.S. Lewis wrote, "The very word membership is of Christian origin, but it has been taken over by the world and emptied of all meaning." We tend to think of members of an organization as similar people coming together. The members of Rotary are similar to one another: professional business people in the community. The members of a club or team are people who are like minded sharing an interest in what the club or team offers. It could be a Golf Club, a Hunting Club, a Sports team, or an Environmental Club. The members of any political party are those who think the same way about the government and issues. Most groups are characterized by members who are similar.

Membership in the church however is marked by our important differences. Lewis writes, "By members Paul meant what we should call *organs*, things essentially different from, and complementary to, one another: things differing not only in structure and function but also in dignity....When we describe a man as 'a member of the church' we usually mean nothing Pauline: we mean only that he is a unit – that he is one more specimen of the same kind of thing as X and Y and Z. How true membership in a body differs from inclusion in a collective may be seen in the structure of a family. The grandfather, the parents, the grown-up son, the child, the dog, and the cat are true members precisely because they are not members or units of a homogeneous class. They are not interchangeable. Each person is almost a species in himself. The mother is not simply a different person from the daughter, she is a different kind of person. The grown-up brother is not simply one unit in the class children, he is a separate estate of the realm. The father and grandfather are almost as different as the cat and the dog. If you subtract any one member you have not simply reduced the family in number, you have inflicted an injury on its structure. Its unity is a unity of unlikes, almost of incommensurables." (Lewis, *Business of Heaven*, August 18)

We celebrate that the membership of the church is diverse, made up of different people with different gifts and different ideas coming together as the body of Christ. Let us recognize the value of each person in the membership of the church because of the diversity they bring. Your participation in the ministry of the church is important because of the differences you bring.

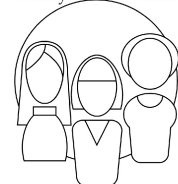
