“Happy Birthday to you, Happy Birthday to you, Happy Birthday dear Christian church, Happy Birthday to you.” On Sunday, June 4 we will

celebrate Pentecost, the birthday of the Christian church.

Pentecost is always 50 days after Easter and marks a very important event in church history, namely the day the church began. After the resurrection and before Jesus ascended into heaven he instructed the disciples to remain in Jerusalem until they received power from the Holy Spirit. Acts 2 tells what happened. *“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.”* The Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and they began to preach the good news of the Gospel. The Apostle Peter delivered his Pentecost sermon and when he was done the crowd asked him what they needed to do. *“Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins are forgiven and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”* (Acts 2:38) Following his sermon 3000 people were baptized,

joined the group of disciples, and the church was born. “Happy Birthday dear Christian church.

The Holy Spirit is the oft forgotten, though critical, part of the Trinity; Father, Son *and* Holy Spirit. In the Presbyterian Church we are comfortable talking about God the Father and we talk a lot about Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. We often forget or overlook the third part of the trinity, the Holy Spirit. But the Holy Spirit began the church and it is the Holy Spirit which continues to empower the church’s ministry. Jesus emphasized how important the Holy Spirit was to the gospel. He said, “It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the (Holy Spirit) will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you....When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth,” (Acts 16:7, 13) and “the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you.” (Acts 14:26) On Pentecost the Holy Spirit empowered the Disciples to continue the ministry Jesus had commissioned them to do. The Holy Spirit continues to empower the Christian church to do ministry.

On June 4, for Pentecost we want to recognize and celebrate the Holy Spirit’s presence in our church. That Sunday the church will be decorated in red, signifying the tongues of fires that touched each disciple as described in Acts 2, and we encourage you to wear red. It can be a red blouse, red tie, red shirt, or just pin a red ribbon on your clothes. I also encourage you read the book of Acts, especially Acts 1-2, to discover how successful the first disciples were in spreading the gospel. The church that began at Pentecost is the ancestral church of First Presbyterian Church of Cheyenne. And on June 4th wish each person in church a very Happy Birthday, the birthday for our church.

Are you seeking to live with a greater sense of purpose? Will you help to transform the world through love and service? There were seven members of the 2016 – 2017 JustFaith group that answered yes to these questions. If you feel called to do the same, I invite you to consider joining the 2017 – 2018 JustFaith small group. Our first meeting will be held on Tuesday September 12. Diana Hartman and Ed Boenish (on the National Board of JustFaith Ministries) will be co-facilitating this ecumenical group. As the time approaches I will share details of where and what time we will meet. While there is a cost associated with this group, scholarships are always available. The regular meeting schedule will be determined by those who sign up and their availability to meet.

Here is what Judi Krieger had to say about her experience this year.

“JustFaith was an eye opener. I knew poverty was bad—but it turns out I had no idea how bad it was.

We had a good group and we learned a lot. I would recommend it to anyone and I want to keep doing the mission we did and hope it helps.”

Thank you Judi for your regular help with Deacon’s projects, serving at COMEA, Coalition for the homeless, Family Promise and the Allen Chapel AME!”

Belinda Smith, another participant shared,

“I encourage any and all to participate in the next session of the JustFaith small group series. Please do not let the time commitment, cost, or amount of reading be a deterrent to signing up. You will form strong bonds with the other participants, and the insight you will gain about your community, country, and the world at large will be lifelong and life changing. You will become more aware of your own part in creating more social justice, and your ability as an individual to make change in our world. I am so much more aware of the poverty, economics and environmental issues, in my community, country and world and that has encouraged me to take a more active part in being the change in my home, church, Cheyenne, and the world at large. Diana and Linda are dynamic and committed facilitators for this group, and have been such a blessing to us all.”

Thank you Belinda for leading the Deacon’s Local Missions and regularly working with the homeless at COMEA, Coalition for the homeless, Allen Chapel AME and serving on the Cheyenne Family Promise Board.

As a co-facilitator I was recently asked to contact Presbyterian Mission Agency with my thoughts on leading this group. There is currently an effort underway to bring

together around 15 denominations to collaborate and offer this curriculum. These are my comments:

“I have just finished taking a small group at my church through the JustFaith ecumenical curriculum provided by the Catholic Church. This has been a very powerful journey for all of us. When we started, the group lacked awareness and any depth of knowledge in many justice issues that plague our world. For the most part the group was not comfortable around homeless people. In addition, we did not know how or if we wanted to become involved with people in our community who were jobless, hungry or homeless. Through the course of 24/ 2 ½ hour sessions, prayers, bible studies, 4 immersion experiences that brought us face to face with people in need, several speakers, and numerous videos as well as the 8 books we read and discussed, we all agree that we have grown in faith, hope, and love of our fellow beings and have a greater care for our environment as well.

We have spent many hours with the homeless in our community, bringing meals and sharing fellowship. The members of this group admit that they no longer cross the street when they see a homeless person on the sidewalk. Instead, they look them in the eye and speak. Each group member is discerning where God may be calling them to participate in God’s mission. Several have already become involved in local and global mission opportunities. The program has not only made us more compassionate with local people, but we have also gained a greater awareness of global justice issues. As we look to be a more mission oriented church, I believe that this program is very useful in that regard. JustFaith is an impactful and transformational program that I highly recommend.”

Irmgard Meyer Grants News

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY - During one of our early rounds of the Irmgard Meyer Grants, we learned that Laramie County Community College had matching grant funds from the State of Wyoming. We took the opportunity to create The Irmgard Meyer First Presbyterian Church Scholarship. They had \$10,000.00 available we gave them \$10,000.00 making the scholarship \$20,000.00.

Those attending LCCC can apply through the Finance Aid Office of LCCC. The scholarship is designed for those from First Presbyterian Church first. If no one from First Presbyterian Church applies it then is opened up to other

students for that year. And, the following year it reverts back to the original setup.

We want our young people to be aware of this opportunity to assist in their education funding. Questions regarding this scholarship should be directed to LCCC Financial Aid Office. We're anxious to see our young people take advantage of this opportunity and celebrate it in our church.

Once again we see the growth of the Irmgard Meyer Grant Program. As I stated at the Congregational meeting this gift is far reaching with grants going as far away as Syria and Bagdad, Iraq and as close as Laramie County Community College. Celebrate our gift.

Spiritual Significance of Hospitality by John S. Mogabgab

It is [the] fundamental reweaving of basic human relationships in Jesus Christ that motivates Paul to declare:

"Welcome one another, therefore, as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God" (Rom. 15:7, NRSV).

Hospitality is a concrete expression of the love that now binds us to God and to one another. ... Hospitality, which shares linguistic history with "hospital," brings healing to host as well as guest because welcoming the stranger is a medium of growth toward fullness of life. In the experience of hospitality both guest and host receive something they need that can only be obtained through the unique ministration of hospitable relationships. Indeed, because hospitality demonstrates a radically transformed human posture of receptivity to God and generosity toward God's creatures, it is a primary sign of the new creation, God's reigning in our midst. ...*From Weavings: A Journal of the Christian Spiritual Life, Vol. IX, No. 1 (January/February 1994), (Nashville: The Upper Room, 1994), 2-3.*

I've included the article above in this column because Small Group Ministry is all about weaving Christian hospitality into our lives. For those who would like to experience Christian hospitality and a chance to make new friends, I hope that you will consider joining one of our small groups this fall. Small groups are often life transforming and often fill that sense of needing to find a greater sense of purpose.

Most of our groups meet from September through May although some may choose to gather year round. You are always welcome to "try out" a group before you

We encourage offering hospitality to newcomers and friends outside of our church family. We do hope that you will become dedicated to your group and attend regularly. Each group determines its own meeting times and places. Leadership training and materials for groups are available in August.

Groups that will continue for the 2017 – 2018 program include: Genealogy; Stitch by Stitch; Hearts and Hands; Walk, Pray, Love; and Men on a Mission. Deanna Dyekman was appointed to the Retreat, Outdoor, Camping, Conferences and Service Committee.

The Friday study session was led by Rob Hagen, from the Presbyterian Foundation. He provided a presentation focusing on a "Culture of Generosity." He presented seven principles:

- Believe it and you'll see it
- Recognize Abundance
- Look for possibilities
- Unleash your energy to fix what is wrong
- Ride the changes
- Take yourself to the edge, and
- Be your best for the world

The Presbytery is offering matching \$3,000 technology grants to all churches.



Mark Frey, the Board of Pensions Regional Representative noted that the Presbyterian Church has emphasized appropriate financial support for the church's ministers and employees for 300 years. In 1717, the first Presbyterian Synod in the New World established a "Fund for Pious Uses" as the forerunner of the current Board of Pensions. Mark noted that the Board is emphasizing just compensation for all church workers, not just ministers.

The Presbytery revised its mission budget to provide a balance this year in the face of declining funding.

Day of Giving is centered on our belief that when we know of a need, we should do what we can to help. Our congregation has helped us 'walk this talk' since Day of Giving began in 2006, and your encouragement has helped keep us going. This year, we adopted Unaccompanied Student Initiatives, an agency to help homeless students with no parent present, and brought our list of supported agencies to 17. That meant we needed your help more than ever. As has been the case in all previous years, you stepped forward in large numbers to help. It is a great feeling to know that First Presbyterian and our congregation are behind this big effort!

Thanks to every single one of you who donated to the Super Bowl collection in January, bought underwear for Undie Sunday, added to the food donations for the Youth Event, volunteered at or before the event, made a financial donation, helped encourage others to participate . . . or did so many other things to move our efforts forward. The Day of Giving motto is the famous quote from Helen Keller, "Together we can do so much," and you are a big part of 'together' in that statement. We have a wonderful congregation, and we work together very well!

The 4th Annual Youth Event on May 11 and the 12th Annual Cheyenne Day of Giving on May 12 had the blessings of beautiful weather and lots of generous donors. Figures are preliminary, but we estimate we

received over 23,000 pounds of food, personal care items, and craft items; 342 pounds of prescription medications; 1600 pounds of medical supplies; 185 pieces of durable medical equipment; 853 pairs of eyeglasses; 68 hearing aids; and 177 cell phones. We also received 39 units of blood at the event and over 100 units at other drives and registered 12 new bone marrow donors on our big day plus 90 at an earlier drive. Put that together with the over \$48,000 we have received from business and individual donations year-over-year, and all we can do is stand in awe of the generosity of our donors. Not only did we have events which brought help to hundreds of people in need but we have the funds to make purchases to help clients at 11 local agencies throughout the year.

What's So Amazing About Grace? -- Author Philip Yancey discusses the importance of God's grace and love to Christians. However, he feels that many of us fail to accept this grace and love and live the way God intended. He points out that we also fail to share that love and grace with others around us.

Just Mercy-a Story of Justice and Redemption – Bryan Stevenson was a young attorney when he discovered the injustice that many received who were poor or of a minority group. He helped establish the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice which defends the poor, the wrongly condemned and others who do not have resources to help them. This book is the sobering story of what many of his clients have faced: laws that discriminate, people whose bias and attitude lead to ignoring the rights of individuals and laws that would help them, and innocent people whose lives are destroyed because they have no way to get help.

The contributions of personal care items for Cheyenne homeless were very generous, as were the monetary gifts from PW groups around the state, targeted to support the development of housing for high school students without homes.
